Dear Scholarship Applicant,

God's blessings to you as you prepare for your future endeavors. First Congregational United Church of Christ, Janesville is blessed with four scholarship funds for members of our congregation who are pursuing higher education. Active membership in First Congregational Church is a common requirement for all scholarships. Some funds may be used by anyone regardless of age, gender, sexual orientation, type of education being pursued. One has an age limit, one limits the total number of grants any one individual, and one is restricted to seminary education. There are funds available for most any kind of additional education thanks to the generous forethought and generosity of past and present members of this congregation. Below is a brief summary of each of our scholarship funds to help you with filling out the attached application.

- In 1997 Ted and Faye Bidwell established the ***Bidwell Scholarship Fund*** to assist congregational members under the age of twenty-seven (27). Criteria for this scholarship are active participation in the life, ministry, and mission of First Congregational Church, high scholastic achievement, and financial need. Grants from this fund are limited to two per person.
- ***Saenger Frick, McBlair, Lee Scholarship*** - First Congregational membership, financial need, application quality, and educational goals are some of the criteria for consideration and awards.
- The ***Griswold Scholarship Fund*** is designated for support of students seeking theological seminary education.
- ***The General Scholarship Fund*** - One must be a member of this congregation to be eligible for a scholarship. There are no restrictions to age, frequency of grants or education sought. This is our most open and flexible fund.

In late April you will receive a letter indicating whether you have been awarded a scholarship and if so, in what amount. Scholarship checks are made out to your college's admission office and are sent to you. **It is your responsibility to see that the check is sent to your college's admission office.**

Incomplete or incomprehensible application forms do not help your request. Please be sure all necessary information is in the church office by **March 15th**.

Each year the Church publicizes in *The Janesville Gazette* news of the recipients of its scholarships. We like to share a picture and information about our recipients in the event the committee grants you a scholarship. Please return a recent photograph of yourself, the application form and your most recent grade transcript by the **March 15th** deadline. We will return the photo to you.

Finally, should you receive a scholarship grant from the Bidwell Scholarship Fund; an expression of gratitude to the Bidwells is both appropriate and appreciated. We encourage you to write them directly.
