You are the key to her success!

June will be a busy month for me as I will be working for *the Church At Large!* June 9-11 you will find me at the WI UCC Annual Meeting at Green Lake Conference Center. Consistory Minutes from May 23rd

Consistory expressed appreciation to Barbara Bendlin for stepping in for Pastor Tanya and sharing her faith story at the May 21 service, to Becky Kingsbury for organizing the volunteers for the Southwest Association meeting, and to all the volunteers who helped on that day.

A team of volunteers will organize fundraising events for the church. Currently members may make a special donation to the church's music program so that we can continue to enjoy guest musicians.

Upcoming volunteer opportunities include ushering on Sunday mornings, hosting coffee hour after the Sunday service, and serving at the GIFTS shelter the week of July 24. The Membership Ministry will help coffee hour hosts with treats and setup.

In her administrative role, Pastor has been meeting weekly with the web designer for the church's new website as well as with the people who will be creating and installing the two new stained-glass windows. She will soon share with the congregation sketches of the windows.

Pastor Tanya continues to provide pastoral care through visits, calls, and messages. This month she has made hospital visits as well as supporting grieving families and officiating at two funerals.

On June 4, the congregation will honor Jamie Dieckhoff for her seventeen years of service as Director of Christian Education. Jamie will continue her service to the UCC as a member of the Committee on Ministry, which oversees new ministers and clergy who enter the Southwest Association.

A new Director of Christian Education has been hired and will soon be introduced to the congregation.

The church welcomed fifty-five clergy and lay leaders to the Southwest Association meeting on May 6. Volunteers from the church staffed a welcome table, set up breakfast, and set up for a catered luncheon.

On June 6, Pastor Tanya will attend the Wisconsin UCC Annual Meeting, and during the week of June 29 through July 5 she will be in Indianapolis participating in the General Synod of the UCC. Also attending General Synod will be Ken Forbeck and Nandini Sadagopan.

Year-to-date pledge income remains above the budgeted amount, though year-to-date expenses are higher than both the budgeted amount and the year-to-date income. The church will see additional income this summer from renting space to the YMCA for a summer camp.

Our congregation is responsible for meals and overnight supervision at <u>GIFTS Men's Shelter</u> the week of July 23rd-30th. We have all of the dinners covered but if you want to join a group that is doing dinner please get a hold of John Mansur. We are still in need of breakfast food being donated for the week (milk, cereal, pancake mix, bacon, etc).

Overnight supervision consists of getting to the shelter by 8:00pm and checking in any men that haven't arrived yet and being available to answer the phone and door if anyone calls or shows up. It is a pretty simple job and usually a quiet night. There is a couch and a cot available for volunteers to sleep on. The shelter's policy is that overnight volunteers be men or a man and woman pair. Thank you for your help in this important church initiative.


