So King Saul said to David, "Go, and may the LORD be with you!"... ⁴⁰ Then David took his staff in his hand and chose five smooth stones from the wadi and put them in his shepherd's bag, in the pouch; his sling was in his hand, and he drew near to the Philistine. Greetings Members and Friends of Janesville UCC!

Against all odds, this is the theme of the LORD God, mighty indeed, who uses the humble to humiliate the strong. Our God cares about the little guy, the forgotten one, the lost child, the single mom trying to make a way out of no way. The Compassionate One is not afraid of challenges that suggest the odds are against us. It is God's unfailing love and call for justice that is best shown when the improbable and unlikely unfold before eyes. Our faith with our actions can take the worst odds and transform them into powerful good for the community. We are used to working against the odds when God is on our side, and we are on God's side. Do you believe it?

This is the heart of the story of David and Goliath! The powerful, well-funded, well-armed strong man will not prevail on the hearty faithful servant child of the One God David. Young David, who will become king against all odds, has the confidence that God is with him when he faces the giant Philistine. The odds are against him, but his faith is bigger than his fear.

You and I are facing challenges that seem to bring impossible odds. Is our faith and activism making a difference in the world? Who are the Goliaths out there that God is sending us to face with smooth stones of love and justice in our hands? A sling seems a little tool to battle against the wills of giants.

You rarely know the good that is being done behind closed doors—so let me share a few giants that the humble Davids in our church are coming to see face to face. Last week a single mom reached out to me as her last resort to find help for her trans child to seek affirming mental and medical healthcare. Behind the scenes we are working through the giant health care system to find the little advocacy group that can help this faithful family. This mom is not giving up on the love for her child, so neither will I as her new pastor! Two weeks ago, I met with another mom going through a divorce. Faced with dramatic changing circumstances in her life, I was able to sit there and listen to the giants she is facing in her life. She has faith that the giants will not win. As her pastor, I am praying for her courage and strength to face them head on! What are the giants in our lives that we fear will overwhelm us and our faith?

Communities of faithful people can stand together with the weak and voiceless and bring the Goliaths in our lives to see the little guy as a formidable foe with which to be reckoned. As a community we are stronger when we work together with one vision, one voice, one mission, and one ministry. We are answering God's call when we show extravagant holy love to our neighbors and work toward Jesus' call to justice for those whose backs are up against the walls of injustice. These are contemporary examples of God's David facing the giant Goliaths of our age. This work is not easy. The odds are against us. Yet, according to Paul, "If God is for us, who is against us? (Romans 8:31)".

Keep the faith in your own calling and ministry. Join one of our small groups at church—join the choir, the Seekers reading group, the AV volunteer team, volunteer on our Christian Education ministry, host fellowship hour, welcome a stranger, or help in the office. Your church needs your support as we are working harder than ever to move through some of the most formidable challenges we have faced—your Christmas in July dollars will help us stay on track in our budget and help meet the shortfall caused by the rise in utility costs. God is using us for great things, but we need you to help us stay faithful all along the way.

Sunday August 27th join us especially for our Outdoor Service with Jazz for Jesus! We will have refreshments—you can bring them to support the Membership Ministry! On that day, we will celebrate the 19th year Music Ministry of Dr. Brian Knutson and our accompanist of two years, his wife, Jan Knutson, as they both retire from Church Music ministry! Send a card. Most of all, show your appreciation. Let us know you value the hard work we put in this community of Christ's ministry for our #loveandjusticechurch. Your kind words, your helpful efforts, your love shown in little ways helps us stand strong against the Goliath's we face every day. God is with us. You matter to us. Keep showing up.



has a history of helping students in the Fourth Ward Neighborhood. This year we will be collecting school supplies and accepting financial donations for Wilson, Rock River Charter School, and Project 16:49. Here are ways you can help:

<u>School Supplies</u>: School supply lists: Wilson School—pencils, markers, scissors, tissues, crayons, glue sticks, expo markers & cleaner. Rock River Charter School—college ruled loose leaf notebooks, pencils, pink pearl erasers, single subject notebooks, pens and tissues. You can purchase school supplies and drop them off in the Fireside Room and they will be delivered to the schools.

<u>Financial Donations:</u> If you pay by check, make the check out to UCC and indicate for school supplies on the memo line, or through Easytithe, https://app.easytithe.com/App/Giving/janesvilleucc. They will be shared equally between Wilson School & Rock River Charter School.

<u>Diapers:</u> Some of the students at Rock River Charter School and Project 16:49 have small children and are in need of diapers. These may be brought and dropped off in the sanctuary. They will be equally shared.
