## Pastor's Message

They were all amazed, and they kept on asking one another, "What is this? A new teaching—with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." Mark 1:27

Dear Members and Friends of Janesville UCC,

February is the month of *looove* and it is also the month of *Lent!* With Ash Wednesday falling on Valentine's Day, one has to ask, 'What does love got to do with Lent?' The journey of Lent, the 40 days plus Sundays between Ash Wednesday and Easter, is a time of contemplation and renewal. It is traditionally associated with fasting and the fish fries celebrated at Catholic parishes. But fasting and giving up things is not really what Lent is about. The whole point of the season is to draw us closer to God and to let go of the things, the addictions, the 'demons' that get in the way of being in God's eyes the best version of ourselves we can be. It is also a time to learn more about who Jesus was so long ago with the disciples and who he is in our life today.

This year will be our last Lenten journey together and I want it to be all about:

How can you and I learn to love our spiritual journey? One of the ways we do that is by learning to love and celebrate who we are. What do you love about yourself? What are you proud of? Where do you see beauty in the life you have built for yourself? What gives you the most joy? What aspects of Jesus' life and ministry do you love most? How might you love a little bit more like Jesus? Jesus commands us, "you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself,'" Mark 12:30-31. Jesus does not say go and give up chocolate and sweets and deny yourself. He commands us to love more deeply, more completely with our entire spirit. That kind of love

demands that we accept ourselves, love God who cherishes us, and find out what we love most about a guy who gave his life to save his friends because he loved them deeply.

Jesus was all about love, so Lent is all about loove too!

I cannot deny it and I would not even if I wanted to: I have loved serving this church and I will miss you, but not just yet. We have done amazing things together and we have a few amazing things yet to do together. Please plan to stop in and say goodbye sometime before then. We will have a reception on April 28<sup>th</sup> to formally release her.

### Consistory Highlights from January 23rd

Consistory expressed appreciation to George Tucker for his help in training our new AV technician, to all those who have said yes to the Nominating Committee when asked to serve on a ministry or committee, to David Arndt for keeping the church's heating equipment running, and to Joellyn Merz as she completes her service on Consistory.

Upcoming after-church gatherings include the multigenerational art activity on January 28, a presentation of the 2024 budget on February 4, the annual meeting on February 11, and the church leadership planning session on February 25.

In the weeks leading up to Easter, Pastor Tanya will continue to build her sermons on the book of Mark. Music Director Robyn Doege-Brennan, working with Pastor Tanya, has selected music for worship services through Easter. Additional plans for Holy Week are underway.

The two new stained-glass windows will be installed in early March. These windows, as well as the Spiritual Arts Center, will be dedicated on March 24. All donor families will be invited to this special event.

The Nominating Committee has almost completed its task of recommending church leaders to be approved at the annual meeting. A few positions do remain open.

The music scholars have returned for the spring semester and will be with us in worship through June 2.

The church's 2023 income was only about \$100 short of the year's expenses. Member contributions, however, were about \$13,500 below the amount anticipated in the 2023 budget.

Rental contracts have been adjusted to reflect the rising cost of utilities. In 2024, the YMCA, Rock County Diversion, and Orion Family Services will be occupying space in our building.

The Finance Ministry and the Endowment Committee met together to plan for the consolidation of endowments. A report on decisions made at that meeting will be available.

To end on an exciting note—over the next two months, Pastor Tanya hopes to finish writing her book *From Outlaw to In-law: How Multicultural Couples Can Become Agents for Social Change*.



#### February Mission -- Palestine Children's Relief Fund

The Palestine Children's Relief Fund (PCRF) is a registered 501(c)(3) non-governmental organization founded in 1991 by concerned humanitarians in the USA.

The PCRF's mission is to provide medical and humanitarian relief collectively and individually to children throughout the Levant, regardless of their nationality or religion.

Over the years, the PCRF has sent over 2,000 affected children abroad for free medical care, has sent thousands of international doctors and nurses to provide free medical care in local hospitals, and provided tens of thousands of children with humanitarian aid and support they otherwise would not get.

PCRF's impact also includes establishing two pediatric cancer departments in Palestine, a new PICU and pediatric cardiology department in Ramallah, and many more critical projects to bolster the region's healthcare system.

PCRF relies on grassroots efforts, supported by a worldwide network of thousands of volunteers, to fulfill its humanitarian mission.


