Membership Ministry for Spring Fling Fellowship after service to gather and catch up with one another. Pastor Bob for reminding us to invite others to our Easter service and forward our FB page. Mary and Joan for putting festive decorations on the outside doors for our Easter service.

Nancy Stabb, treasurer, reported that income is stable; a new snow removal contract is out for bid; and we're saving \$400/month on insurance due to Nancy's impeccable attention to detail. The April 23 Empty Chair Town Hall was a success with over 300 people in attendance from 6:30p to 8:30p. More details to follow.


