

# Pastor's Message

I'm grateful for the opportunity to attend the 35<sup>th</sup> General Synod of the United Church of Christ. Synod is a unique gathering of the United Church of Christ. It's family reunion, a business meeting and a time for celebratory worship, and an opportunity for service.

It was a joy to gather with friends from across Wisconsin and the United States. It was also great to meet new people who love God and the church. There were over 1,800 people present, including delegates, staff, and guests. We welcomed 21 new or renewing congregations into the denomination.

One quote that stood out for me in Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson, the General Minister and President of the UCC is as follows. Here in the United States, nationalism is a spawn of American Exceptionalism, a toxic presence that is rooted in hatred and the glorification of whiteness. Patriotism is the love of one's country. It is possible to love country and all the people.

Following the lead of Robin Wall Kimmerer, the themes throughout each worship service were stages in the life of sweetgrass, planting, growing, harvesting, braiding, and burning. The service project consisted of collecting copies of banned books, sorting them, and packing boxes to be sent to church libraries in areas where those books are banned in the public libraries.

General Synod 35 took on a wide range of business items. Here are some highlights:

We established Full Communion relationships between the United Church of Christ and Evangelische Kirche in Deutschland and Iglesia Evangélica Unida de Puerto Rico.

We made a declaration of Support for Philippine Human Rights.

We acknowledged the faithful stewardship of **Our Whole Lives** and advocacy for comprehensive sexuality education in faith communities through interfaith collaboration.

We responded to the Federal Government's Attack on Immigrants, Migrants, and Refugees and we called on the United Church of Christ to Oppose the 2025 Immigration Rollbacks and Support Immigrants, Refugees, and Pacific Island Communities, while Amplifying Antiracist Work on Behalf of Black, Indigenous, and People of Color in Response to the current socio-political backlash.

Finally, we, General Synod 35, called for an end to the genocide in Palestine.

If you would like to be a delegate to the next General Synod, which will be in Cleveland during the summer of 2028, let's talk.

#### FROM OUTREACH:

Our church's monthly mission for August is school supplies. In recent years our congregation has collected school supplies for Wilson Elementary School and Rock River Charter School. We also offer the option of making a financial donation. Both schools are located in our neighborhood and have a high number of students living in poverty. We also are collecting diapers for students at Rock River Charter School and indivduals served by Project 16:49.

School supplies for Wilson School students include pencils, expo markers and cleaner, markers, crayons, scissors, glue sticks, and tissues.

School supplies for Rock River Charter School include college ruled loose leaf notebooks, single subject notebooks, pencils, pens, pink pearl erasers, tissues, disinfecting wipes, and diapers.

School supplies and diapers may be dropped off in the Fireside Room on Sunday morning or during office hours.

Any financial donations will be shared between Wilson School and Rock River Charter School. Financial donations may be made by using the envlopes found in the pews or by check with 'school supplies' written on the memo line. Community Meal is an outreach that our church has participated in for over 15 years. We serve a healthy, balanced meal to those in our community who need or desire a freshly prepared meal. It is served the first Saturday of each month. We began serving it as an indoor sit-down meal but has transformed into a to-go style meal. We currently serve over 100 meals each month.
