## Pastor's Message

Friends,

I have some good news to share. I don't generally like to use this space for personal matters. However, I'm going to be gone for two weeks this month, and, in the interests of transparency, I thought it best to share it here.

After extended conversations with my doctors, I have elected to go in for bariatric surgery. I will have a Roux-en-Y Gastric Bypass (shrinking the size of my stomach). Maintaining a healthy weight has been a lifelong struggle. The older I get, the more concerned I am about living a long, healthy, and happy life. While not a magic wand, this surgery will be a helpful tool to live the life I want to live.

Surgery is set for the 13<sup>th</sup>. I will be out on Sunday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, and 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Rev. Neil Deupree will be leading worship on those Sundays. I pray you will use that as an opportunity to come to worship expressing your love for God and one another, even in my absence.

While this surgery is routine, and Froedtert has a top-notch cadre of doctors, it's not routine for me. I ask for your prayers for me, my surgical team, and my family. While I am gone, I will be healing, praying for you, and preparing for the Advent and Christmas seasons.

I look forward to worshipping with you on November 30<sup>th</sup>, the First Sunday in Advent.

## **CONSISTORY MEETING OCTOBER 20**

After ratifying Deb Lalor as clerk, appreciations were expressed. Appreciations were given for Debbi Cox for her written Sunday School reviews which offer a review of Sunday School happenings and suggestions for parents. A second appreciation was given for Robyn Doege-Brennan for covering for Paul as he awaits a surgery,

Treasurer Nancy Stabb presented a summary of income and expenses for the month and year to date. Income for September was \$43,126.11 reflecting the generous \$30,000 anonymous member gift we received that month. Expenses were \$23,899.79. Year to Date Sept. 30. both income and expenses have exceeded our budgeted estimates with income slightly ahead. We do not expect any unusual expenses aside from those associated with moving Rev. Barlow to Wisconsin. Mission giving date is \$17,693.18.

We are off to a good start on our fund-raising to cover moving expenses for BJ and Megan. We will continue to receive weekly updates. President Darla Denovsek reported back on her attendance at a "Partners in Building" conference. She learned of many ways churches are utilizing their buildings to address the needs of church and community. The Personnel Committee passed a motion to release Pastor Bob from his obligation to the church on December 31, 2025. The Outreach Committee is looking to provide furnishings for an apartment for the Next Steps Resiliency Center located at the former Royce Elementary School in Beloit and into possibly providing gas and laundry cards for the Janesville Community Center. The finance committee reports a snow plowing contract was signed. The contract will pay for plowing per snowfall. The Membership Committee has ordered canvas signs to be placed outside the church to announce the arts, crafts and bake sale in December. They hope to have a baking time at the church in November.

The next Consistory meeting will be on November 17, 2025 at 6:30 pm at the church.

This year, we're asking you to fill out the pledge card even if you intend to leave the amount blank, so we know that you are still a part of God's Dream for our church in 2026.

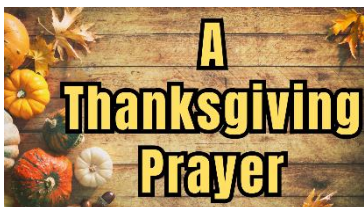

At the August 18, 2025, Consistory meeting, changes to our **by-laws** were **approved**. Here are some of the highlights of the changes:



- Language was updated for easier reading and roles, relationships and duties were clarified.
- The Consistory, ministry groups and committees are smaller to reflect the size of our congregation.
- Ministry and committee members are elected for staggered terms.
- Interim committee or ministry appointments are to be approved by the Consistory.
- The “Shared Ministry” committee name is reverting to its previous name, “Pastoral Relations”.
- The Nominating Committee chair no longer has a term limit.
- Consistory, ministry and committee meetings may be held in person, using electronic media, or a mix of the two.
- The president of the congregation may serve no more than two consecutive terms.
- There is no assumption that the vice president of the congregation will move up to be president when their term ends.

Changes to the Constitution are also being considered. After they are shared with the Consistory, they will be presented at the next congregational meeting for approval.
