CONSISTORY MEETING September 15

Appreciations were given for Bob for the way he helped the kids count the people in church Sunday and for the positive way he interacts with kids; Mike Rundle for moving the chairs out of the balcony, taking care of pew pieces and replacing some treads on the stairway; David Arndt for repairing some pews; Neil Deupree, George Salter, Jim Holtz, Wilhelmina Capozziello, and Dave Groth for painting the shed.

Nancy Stabb shared the financial report. There will be some additional expenses for travel for our Pastor candidate and upcoming moving expenses. There has been a personal donation to help with flight expenses. There was also an anonymous donation made for the Operating budget. A schedule was given for the weekend of September 21st for meeting the Pastor candidate and the service he will lead. The membership meeting to vote on the candidate will immediately follow the church service on September 21st.

Outreach is looking to repair or replace one of our Little Free Libraries. They are also exploring furnishing an apartment for the Next Steps Family Resilience Center located at the former Beloit Royce Elementary School which will include people from all of Rock County, including Janesville. Membership is planning a Hee Haw Halloween potluck on October 12th. Finance reported that two new benches at the doors have been donated by Bill Williams and the Mary Rockenfield memorial fund. The Pastoral Search Committee will head up a fund drive to help pay for the moving expenses for the new pastor. We are still looking for a new clerk. Neil Deupree is working with the Rock County MigraWatch Team to bring to Janesville an expert on immigration issues to do some in-person training, probably in October.

The next Consistory meeting will be on October 20, 2025, at 6:30 p.m. at the church.


