## ***CONSISTORY MEETING December 15<sup>th</sup>***

Appreciations for for the excellent Christmas pageant performed by the Sunday school. For everyone who participated in making the craft and bake sale, especially Diana Huckstep for organizing it. For Pastor Bob for all he has done and continues to do as we transition. For Linda Salter for organizing the “ Comfort and Joy” celebration. For our church secretary, Becky, for all she does including all the extra tasks she is performing during our time of transition.

The treasurer presented a summary of Income and Expenses for the month of November and for Year to Date. Prior to the craft and bake sale we had raised \$5154 through Fund Raising activities not including the money for the new pastor’s move. We have raised over \$10,000 to help with the moving expenses. This will not cover all those expenses but we have money in the Leadership Giving Endowment spendable account to cover the remainder. We have sufficient funds in the checking account to cover expected expenses for the rest of the year.

The Stewardship campaign was successful. We have 57 pledges many from new members which is reassuring. There are some members who for various reasons do not pledge but are nevertheless generous in their giving. I think we are better off heading into 2026 than we were a year ago thanks to all the new pledges. I appreciate the members who set up regular payments toward their pledged commitment. That is really what sustains us.

The Boys and Girls Club requested use of the Spiritual Center space for a meeting. The Consistory passed a motion to offer the space at a 50% discount in exchange for advertising the space to potential renters for future events. Our church will welcome two new members in December. A private funeral will be held at the church for Dr. Katsumi Neeno. Our church has accepted an invitation to receive a traveling exhibit depicting the history of the Wisconsin Conference of the United Church of Christ. The exhibit will be displayed for viewing at the reception following Pastor Barlow’s installation.

The Outreach Committee is investing in a new Little Library. This box will be made of a composite material which will withstand weather conditions better than wood. It will have two shelves. One for books and one for personal items. Building improvements are in progress at Jeffris Flats. Sara Beers attended the YMCA Rock County Racial Justice Conference. Sara Beers and Patti York toured the Next Steps Family Resilience Center.

The Finance Committee reports the warming center for unhoused individuals, holds 18 cots and is supervised by Rock County Human Services employees in the lower level of our church. It has been activated 7 nights and is very much appreciated. A necessary additional lock was purchased for \$354. Upgrades and repairs to the lighting at the Southside entrance will be made. Church volunteers have been packing up lunches for those in need of the shelter. These lunches are distributed to them as they leave in the morning.

The Membership Committee reports that the despite bitter cold weather the craft and bake sale was a success. It was decided to extend the sale into the following weekend to give shoppers an extra opportunity in gentler weather conditions. A sign will be up to welcome people to the Christmas Eve services. Fellowship Hours will be held in the last two weekends of December.

The Nominating Committee reports that the committees are “filling up nicely.” There are still a few openings. And, they add they are looking to fill two positions on the Personnel Committee.

The Immigrant Task Committee reports they are focusing on training people to help with completing paperwork and getting needed notarizations. And, they are looking for volunteers for this. The Town Hall Coalition is also planning to have a public presentation that will focus on what it is like to be an immigrant here. Next Consistory meeting on January 19, 2026.

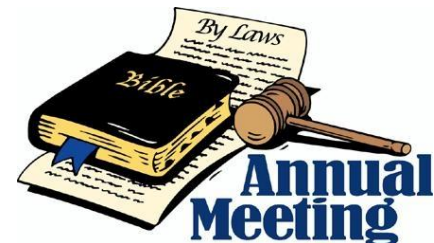
